The Columbia/Boone County League is collaborating with MU faculty to help students gain the knowledge and confidence to exercise their right to vote. Members Susie Adams, Linda Headrick, and Linda Smith worked with Boone County Clerk Brianna Lennon and course director Melissa Herzog to create two videos for "Successful Adulting." This 8-week course covers many topics related to independence, critical thinking, and decision-making to prepare students for adulthood. Voting is now one of them! The League also provided a resource guide with links to reliable US, Missouri, and local information sources.

The 8-week in-person course began in late March and will reach 125 students. There is a long waiting list, and Dr. Herzog is working toward offering the class more than once a year.
